- Facilitate student involvement in ongoing institutional projects.
- Teach a learning-by-doing module focused on agile project management methods.

## 5. Visibility and communication:

- Design a communications strategy to share project outcomes.
- Oversee the creation of tailored communication materials for different audiences.
- Coordinate with the Marketing and Communications Office to promote key results across communication channels.



- Assist with executive summaries and impact reports.

- Identify areas for improvement in project management.
- Document lessons learned.
- Promote the alignment of project efforts with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and ESG (Environmental, Social, and Governance) standards.
- Support knowledge sharing and organizational learning.
