About the Opportunity

Zamorano University is seeking Regional Lead Technicians to support the territorial implementation of the SAG-Zamorano project in prioritized intervention areas. This position will play a key role in organizing the work of the field technical team, following up with beneficiary producers, and ensuring that activities are carried out in an organized, timely, and methodologically aligned manner.

Position Objective

Coordinate the technical and operational implementation of the project in the assigned region by directly supervising agricultural technicians, livestock technicians, and junior technicians, while overseeing planning, documentation, and compliance with territorial goals.

What You Will Do

- Develop and monitor the regional work plan in coordination with the General Technical Coordinator.
- Coordinate the activities of the technical team assigned to the region.
- Supervise the identification, characterization, and follow-up of beneficiary producers.
- Ensure the proper application of diagnostic tools, baseline surveys, technical forms, and field records.
- Organize and supervise technical assistance activities, training sessions, field days, and farm visits.
- Verify that technicians properly document each visit, training session, and completed activity.
- Consolidate regional technical reports, including progress, results, challenges, photographic evidence, and recommendations.

- Coordinate with local stakeholders, regional SAG offices, municipalities, producer associations, and other territorial partners.
- Facilitate the identification of demonstration farms and plots with lead producers and strategic locations for project activities.
- Monitor compliance with technical indicators and regional targets.
- Report in a timely manner any situation that could affect project implementation.
- Ensure the proper use of materials, equipment, supplies, and resources assigned to the region.
- Prepare interim and final technical and financial reports.
- Comply with and uphold the policies, procedures, internal regulations, and Code of Conduct of Zamorano University.

What We Are Looking For

- Master's degree or Engineering degree in Agronomy, Animal Science, Animal Production, Rural Development, or related fields.
- Minimum of 3 to 5 years of experience in technical assistance projects, rural extension, agricultural production, or livestock production.
- Ability to coordinate and collaborate with key organizations within the region.
- Experience supervising field technical teams.
- Knowledge of the assigned territory and agricultural and livestock production systems.
- Ability to organize activities with producers, local institutions, and technical teams.
- Skills in preparing technical reports, schedules, field reports, and verification documents.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office, digital data collection tools, and basic drone operation for agriculture.
- Valid driver's license.
- Availability to reside within the assigned intervention area.

Work location: Project intervention areas (Olancho, Colón, and El Paraíso)

Estimated duration: 6 months, with the possibility of continuation depending on approval of a second phase of implementation.
